
The annual report analyzed responses from 76,256 respondents with regards to 257

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

The Poverty of Loneliness!

We hear a great deal these days of the increasing poverty in our society and in our community. For most of us "poverty" evokes pictures of people living in substandard housing with no means of accessing what we would consider basic necessities; e.g., food, medicine, clothing.

However, there is another level of poverty that is becoming epidemic particularly among the older population. That is the poverty of loneliness. This occurs when nurturing relationships are missing in their lives.

The basic needs of housing, food, and health care may be met through community organizations and programs. The big question is how can we identify those who go from day to day with very little or even no human contact to remind them of their worth?

What can we do to dispel the terrible loneliness that overcomes them? Do we really care about this segment of our population?

What difference could we make if each person reading article reached out to one elderly person and followed through with an appropriate action; e.g., a phone call, a trip to the grocery store (stopping for an ice cream cone or a cup of tea!), stopping in for conversation, a card reminding them that they are important to us......There are 168 hours in every week. Can we even imagine what the gift of one hour could do to dispel loneliness?

Yes, we are a busy society, but we need to remember that it is possible that one day we, too, could sense that same loneliness. What would brighten our day?

Walking for Fitness...

Your Doctor should be able to point you in the right direction, the rest is in your hands or should we say 'Feet"

Many people who come to us want to walk more. They may have difficulty walking because of postural pain, disability, lung capacity or circulatory problems. Often, they will say: "My Doctor says I need to walk for my heart" or "My dog's putting on too much weight and so am I". Since our primary goal is to improve activity level, we always have input. With a bit of history, we can usually figure out how to get you moving more comfortably.

Although the tangible parts (footwear, socks and orthotics) are important sometimes the biggest "stumbling block" is motivation. "My balance is poor and I am afraid of falling". "I can only walk so far and I am exhausted (or in pain – or both)".

In our community there are plenty of fitness resources to help you, whatever your age. These days there are many therapists who specialize in movement and balance and can help guide you to better fitness. These "body workers" are always happy to advise you on exercise and pain relief. The starting point is not "I want to be healthier" but "I am going to be healthier". Here are a few considerations.

Balance – Stable shoes with soles that are proper for the surfaces you walk on; warm up stretching geared to make you more aware of your deficiencies in balance; Nordic walking poles or a cane if necessary.

Pain – Better footwear; graduated exercise and stretching; Physiotherapy or massage therapy; balanced foot orthotics.

Conditioning – This is a self-fulfilling thing. Once you get started, your conditioning will improve and you will feel stronger clearer and if not able to eradicate pain at least come to terms with it.

So, talk to the Doc. Your Doctor should be able to point you in the right direction, the rest is in your hands (or feet). Get out and smell the roses. It'll do you a world of good. *-Terry Trask C. Ped.* (C)






Explore Canada's Oldest Woolen Mill...

Briggs & Little Woolen Mills Ltd. has been the name of the woolen mill located in York Mills, NB, Canada, since 1916. Previous to that it was called Little's Woolen Mills, and previous to that York Woolen Mills. To date, the woolen mill has been operating for 162 years.

The mill was first started in 1857 and in the 1890's it was bought by Roy Little, who ran it until 1916. The business was then bought by Mathew Briggs and Howard Little, giving us the name Briggs & Little Woolen Mills Ltd. John Little and Michael Little, father and son, are currently the sole owners of Briggs and Little Woolen Mills Ltd. In 2016, Briggs & Little celebrated 100 years of the "Little" blood-line. Currently there are three generations, as Michael's eldest and youngest sons also work in the mill.


Briggs & Little carries an inventory of 100% Canadian made pure wool yarns in over 80 shades and 8 weights. Sizes vary from 24sts to 10cm (4 in.) and 1720 yds/lb., to 11sts to 10cm (4 in.) and 340 yds/lb. We also have a classic aran weight available in white only, and an 80%/20% wool nylon blend yarn available in 15 shades. Our wool spun and roving unspun are suitable for hand-knitting, machine-knitting, crocheting, rug hooking, punching, macramé and weaving.

Briggs & Little FACTS: • Due to devastating fires, the mill has been re-built 4 times. Most recently in 1994 • The first colors other than white, grey and black where introduced in the 1940's and included Scarlet, Blue and Paddy Green. • The mill was partially powered by water until 1994. • Ward Little worked over 60 years at the mill and John Little reached a 50 year milestone in the office in 2020.

Fundy Trail Parkway is a 2,559-hectare (6,323 acre) park featuring a 30 km (19 mile) drive hugging the southern coast of New Brunswick on the world-famous Bay of Fundy. The park entrance is located 10 km east of St. Martins, less than an hour's drive from Saint John and Sussex. The recently completed parkway features 21 lookouts, 15 observation decks, 5 tidal swept beaches and 4 waterfalls to enjoy. Guests can drive the paved parkway along magnificent coastal cliffs that tower at the water's edge. Easily accessible, the lookouts are situated right along the parkway while additional observation decks require a short hike. It is a great place to lace up your hiking boots and choose one of the nineteen trails to explore or hop on your mountain bike and discover some of the new pathways.

Carved out of the Fundy escarpment, this is one of the last remaining coastal wilderness areas between Florida and Labrador. The Fundy Trail understands and strives to maintain the delicate balance of human access while preserving the ecosystem, wilderness, and local history. "Give me a Hoe and Pruners, and I'm a Happy Camper..."

Such a quintessential summer scene is this, the clear blue water of the pond surrounded by lush and colourful garden plants, the blue waters of the Kennebecasis behind. Betty and I love taking an evening stroll these days, as there is always something new coming into bloom, or ripening in the vegetable garden. It took a lot of work to create this scene, and just as much to maintain it, but the work is a joy to me, and the results so worth the effort.

Give me a hoe and a pair of pruners and a messy bed to tackle (preferably my own!), and I'm a happy camper!

Let's look at a few of the plants and landscape details we see in

this picture. Years ago, I saw a large pond at Fox Harbour golf course in Nova Scotia that had stepping stones somehow suspended on the water as if floating, and I had thought that such an impressive concept ever since, that I finally tackled reproducing it when I built this pond five years ago.




Orange daylilies and pink Asiatic lilies.

I won't divulge the engineering tact I devised, but it has worked splendidly, and allows a visitor a unique experience 'walking on water' and viewing life in and around the pond from all angles. The goldfish swim back and forth under your feet as you cross, and you can touch the water lilies in full bloom. A bull frog and several lesser cousins provide visual and vocal entertainment from time to time.

You can't see all the other water from this spot, but there are two brooks that flow out of two small ponds at the upper end of that brick patio, completely surrounding it with moving water, and cascade into this big pond in two sets of waterfalls. The sounds and sights as you sit on that patio are a joy.

Now let's take a spin around the pond in a clockwise direction, starting in the right foreground with a tall beebalm plant that has nearly finished its show for the summer. The hummingbirds have enjoyed their wild and crazy looking bright red flowers for over a month now. The mauvy-purple spikes at the bottom are Liatris, whose colourful spires bloom rather backwards, top to bottom. Above them the red cones are annual Celosia (a.k.a. cockscomb).

Though not well-lit in this photo, I have planted drifts of them throughout all the beds, and the scarlet accents near green foliage are striking. Moving left again, the shrub with the large clusters of white flowers is peegee hydrangea. Hard to establish now in areas plagued by deer, I can grow them once again here because the entire property is now deer-fenced. Peegee slowly forms large conical heads of white flowers that gradually turn pink with the onset of cold in September.

Behind the hydrangea, tall spikes of yellow flower are the perennial Ligularia 'The Rocket'. This one is deer proof, blooming well in full sun, but also tolerating a fair degree of shade if you need it to, which is unusual for most flowering perennials.

Do give it the overhead space for its 4-5' tall spikes to reach up-

ward. Finally, on the far side of the pond you can just see three clumps of bright pink, on plants about 3' tall.

They are garden phlox, now in full bloom for the next month or more, providing not only intense pinks,

purples and reds, but a gorgeous perfume as you stroll or sit nearby. Sadly for you living outside the fence, a favourite menu item for deer!

Now, you may not want to go quite this far with your own gardens, not owning a landscaping business or garden center as we do, but any garden can give you similar joy. It is not the size of the garden that brings you pleasure, but the time and care you put into it.
